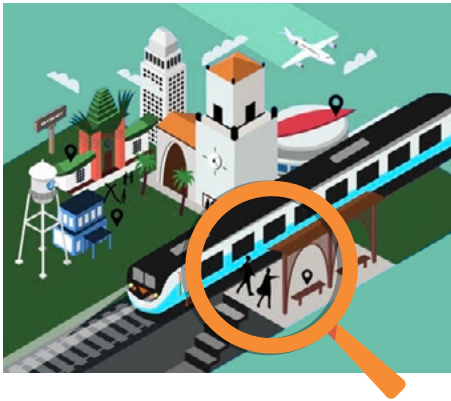

Looking for a Better Way to Get to Work?

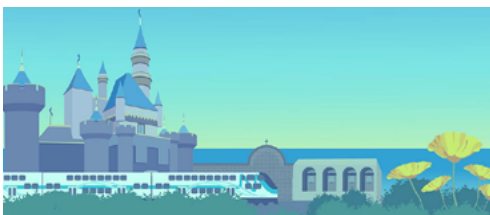

Introducing...the 10 Commuter Link
SunLine Transit Agency launched 10 Commuter Link—express bus service between the Coachella Valley and the San Bernardino Transit Center. The 92-mile route travels in time-saving carpool lanes on the 10, with five stops and a connection to Metrolink.

Get Home with GRH

If you rideshare to work in Ventura County, you can **get a free ride home in case of emergency** through the Guaranteed Ride Home (GRH) program. Now participants can choose to get home via a transportation network company (such as Uber or Lyft) or taxi. (Rental car is no longer offered.)
